# RACINE COUNTY COVID-19 UPDATE May 7, 2020

#### Confirmed coronavirus cases

United States: 1,245,622

Wisconsin: 9,215

Central Racine County Health Department: 236 confirmed (plus 82 probable); 11 deaths City of Racine Public Health Department: 389 confirmed (plus 72 probable); 5 deaths

Racine County total: 625 confirmed (plus 154 probable); 16 deaths

Note: Probable cases are symptomatic individuals who have not been tested but are presumed positive because they had direct contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19, or whose COVID-19 test results were inconclusive.
