## **RACINE COUNTY COVID-19 UPDATE** **June 11, 2020**

### **Confirmed coronavirus cases**

United States: 2,013,940

Wisconsin: 21,926

Central Racine County Health Department: 603 confirmed, 131 probable, 9,250 negative, 31 deaths

City of Racine Health Department: 1,371\* confirmed, 183 probable, 8,290 negative, 21 deaths  
\* Corrected from previously reported count

Racine County total: 1,974 confirmed, 314 probable, 17,540 negative, 52 deaths

Positive test percentage: 10.1%

National and international public health experts continue to warn that the public should be prepared for another round of COVID-19 this fall, based on patterns of other seasonal coronaviruses and influenza viruses.
