## RACINE COUNTY COVID-19 UPDATE September 14, 2020

### Confirmed coronavirus cases

United States: 6,535,105 confirmed, 194,252 deaths\*

Wisconsin: 89,956 confirmed, 1,273,607 negative, 1,210 deaths

Central Racine County Health Department: 1,949 confirmed (+45 from last week), 205 probable (+4), 32,542 negative (+1,669), 61 deaths (+2)

City of Racine Health Department: 2,256 confirmed (+33 from last week), 253 probable (+7), 25,218 negative (+1,111), 33 deaths (+0)

Racine County total: 4,205 confirmed (+78 from last week), 458 probable (+11), 57,760 negative (+2,780), 94 deaths (+2)

Positive test percentage: 6.8%

*(\*In last week's update, the number of global COVID-19 deaths was mistakenly listed instead of the number of U.S. deaths)*

### Updates for the week of September 14:

- Like other parts of the state and country, Racine County has seen testing numbers decline, in part due to national supply shortages. We continue to encourage anyone experiencing symptoms or who have had contact with a confirmed COVID-19 case to get tested.
