## **RACINE COUNTY COVID-19 UPDATE March 22, 2021**

### **COVID-19 cases**

United States: 29,848,830 confirmed, 542,636 deaths

Wisconsin: 572,770 confirmed, 2,688,686 negative, 6,576 deaths

Central Racine County Health Department: 12,006 cases (combined confirmed and probable), 64,041 negative, 210 deaths

City of Racine Public Health Department: 9,309 cases (combined confirmed and probable), 46,616 negative, 114 deaths

Racine County total: 21,315 cases (combined confirmed and probable), 110,657 negative, 324 deaths

### **Updates for the week of March 22:**

- A community-based vaccination clinic at Regency Mall begins tomorrow, March 23. Hours of operation are 11 a.m. to 7 p.m., Tuesdays through Saturdays, in the former Burlington Coat Factory location. (South end of the mall next to Planet Fitness)
- Residents interested in receiving a vaccine at the clinic should register with the Wisconsin Vaccine Registry at <https://vaccinate.wi.gov>. Those who register will receive an invitation to make an appointment after they become eligible for the vaccine. Individuals can also register by phone by calling toll-free 844-684-1064 (interpreters available for non-English speakers).
- The City of Racine's RYDE Transit System is offering free rides to community members going to a vaccination site or who just got vaccinated and need to return to their home or work.
- Starting today, March 22, Wisconsin residents with certain medical conditions are eligible for the vaccine. For a list of medical conditions and more information, [visit the DHS "Am I Eligible for the Vaccine?" page](#).
- The City of Racine Public Health Department has released a revised version of the City's "Safer Racine" ordinance which loosens some restrictions in the ordinance and allows for capacity increases in many categories of establishments as well as mass gatherings.   - As of today, March 22, 46,374 Racine County residents (23.6 percent of the population) had received at least one dose of the vaccine. 25,216 residents (12.8 percent) have completed the vaccine series.
  - The Wisconsin National Guard is conducting drive-thru COVID-19 testing at Festival Hall in the City of Racine on Mondays from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Pre-register by visiting <https://register.covidconnect.wi.gov/en-US/>. Health care providers and pharmacies also continue to provide COVID tests.
