COVID-19 cases

United States: 30,735,626 confirmed, 555,226 deaths

Wisconsin: 580,184 confirmed, 2,749,514 negative, 6,640 deaths

Central Racine County Health Department: 12,760 cases (combined confirmed and probable), 65,413 negative, 210 deaths

City of Racine Public Health Department: 9,456 cases (combined confirmed and probable), 47,414 negative, 116 deaths

Racine County total: 22,216 cases (combined confirmed and probable), 112,827 negative, 326 deaths

- As of today, April 5, 59,850 Racine County residents (30.5 percent of the population) had received at least one dose of the vaccine. 35,952 residents (18.3 percent) have completed the vaccine series.
