RACINE COUNTY COVID-19 UPDATE **April 22, 2021**

COVID-19 vaccination updates for April 22:

- Beginning next week, the DHS Community-Based Vaccination Clinic at Regency Mall is offering employers and community organizations the opportunity to reserve blocks of time for staff, membership and their families to receive the COVID-19 vaccine. Businesses or organizations interested should contact the Central Racine County Health Department (262-898-4460) or City of Racine Public Health Department (262-636-9201) for more details. Businesses [may be eligible for a tax credit for providing paid vaccination leave](#).
- The Wisconsin Department of Health Services is encouraging residents to use the [CDC VaccineFinder](#) to find the COVID-19 vaccine in their area. This will eventually replace the DHS map of COVID-19 vaccine providers.
- Advocate Aurora is providing the COVID-19 vaccine to anyone who is 16 and older, whether you are a patient or not, seven days a week. Schedule now in Advocate Aurora's LiveWell app, online at [aah.org](#) or by phone at (886) 443-2584. Walk-ins are not accepted.
- As of today, April 22, 74,038 Racine County residents (37.7 percent) have received at least one dose, while 51,692 Racine County residents (26.3 percent) have completed the vaccine series.
