## **RACINE COUNTY COVID-19 UPDATE May 24, 2021**

### **COVID-19 cases**

United States: 33,134,618 confirmed, 590,141 deaths

Wisconsin: 608,583 confirmed, 2,929,818 negative, 6,990 deaths

Central Racine County Health Department: 13,434 cases (combined confirmed and probable; +30 from last week), 71,636 negative (+598), 212 deaths (+1)

City of Racine Public Health Department: 10,263 cases (combined confirmed and probable; +71 from last week), 50,950 negative (+494), 120 deaths (+1)

Racine County total: 23,697 cases (combined confirmed and probable; +101 from last week), 122,586 negative (+1,092), 332 deaths (+2)

### **Updates for the week of May 24:**

- If you haven't gotten your vaccine yet, there are plenty of options available in Racine County. Find the vaccine provider nearest you by visiting the [CDC Vaccine Finder](#).
- The community-based clinic at Regency Mall continues to accept walk-ins and offer the Pfizer vaccine, currently the only vaccine approved for children age 12 to 17. The clinic is open from 11 a.m. to 7 p.m. Tuesdays through Saturdays. Residents should enter in the southwest entrance next to Planet Fitness. Those under 18 must have a parent or guardian present.
- As of today, May 24, 84,593 Racine County residents (43.1 percent) have received at least one dose, while 72,169 Racine County residents (36.8 percent) have completed the vaccine series.
- Statewide, healthcare providers have given 42.6 percent of doses, while pharmacies have given 27.2 percent, local health departments have given 16.6 percent, and community-based clinics have given 7.6 percent, according to the state Department of Health Services. A total of 46.8 percent of Wisconsin residents have received at least one dose of the vaccine, and 40.9 percent of Wisconsin residents have completed the series.
